• the Norwegian Government's most important instrument for innovation and development of Norwegian enterprises and industry

• Ownership:

Ministry of Trade, Industry and Fisheries (51 %) the 19 Norwegian county municipalities (49 %)

- •The Norwegian Parliament yearly decides the economic extent of financial services of Innovation Norway in the National State Budget
- •Innovation Norway's roots: From the year 1852



Results First Call

(launched 6 December 2012)

EUR 11,6 mill available

Target group: Bulgarian entities in partnership with Norwegian entities.

42 applications submitted, 16 shortlisted

13 projects approved, project contracts in process

Challenges: Co-financing and financial situation of applicants

Sustainability of partnerships

Cooperation with the Bulgarian National Focal Point and line ministries



Second call - Highlights

EUR 4,4 mill available

Grant amount min EUR 200 000/ max EUR 500 000

Target group: Bulgarian SMEs

Maximum grant rates: in line with state aid regulations:

Investments – 50% plus SME bonus 10 to 20 percent

Experimental development – 25 % plus SME bonus and collaboration bonuse 15% under certain conditions

Training in relation to investments – 25% for specific training

Travel support for partnership development: lump sum EUR 1 200



Target group

Bulgarian Small and Medium sized companies

Small company:

- less than 50 employees
- Turnover and balance sheet less than EUR 10 mill

Medium sized company:

- less than 250 employees
- Turnover less than EUR 50 mill
- Balance less than EUR 43 mill

Figures from the whole group to be included if owned by another company




Partnership

Eligible partners

Enterprises, research institutions, NGOs, organisations and clusters, from Norway and Bulgaria



Legal issues in partnership configurations

Eligible activities

Development, implementation and investment in innovative environmental friendly technologies

Development of green products and services

Development and implementation of greener production processes (material efficiency/efficiency in business operations)

Other activities such as training and awareness raising as secondary activity related to the above activities



What do we mean by green?

- Technologies which are less environmentally harmful than the technology in use today
- Development/implementation of green products and services
- Material efficiency, improving the supply-chain, and the use and re-use of recycled materials
- Efficiency in business operations as solutions/systems related to management, HR, smart purchasing, inventions, CSR, networking, clustering



What do we mean by innovation? Something new

- Products or services
- Production processes
- Organisation of a company or an entity
- Market innovation, not market adaption

Why donor partnership?

- Strenghten bilateral relations between Norway and Bulgaria
- Increased quality of the project
- 1+1=3
- Long term co-operation, beyond the deadline for implementation
- Shared results, not a financing of Norwegian exports to Bulgaria
